2. Updates/Announcements

a. AY 2014-15 TAOC Membership (Appendix A)

TAOC members are to review the roster in Appendix A and email any corrections to jurau@pa.gov by COB September 19. An updated copy of the Membership Roster will be posted on PA TRAC the following week. (NOTE: The roster is posted on the Administrators → TAOC Policies page.)

Theresa (Terry) Barnaby has been named Acting Deputy Secretary of Postsecondary and Higher Education at PDE. The transfer law charges the Secretary of Education with being the chair of TAOC but permits the appointment of a designee. Terry will now serve as chair of TAOC and will lead the November 6 meeting.

b. Equivalency Standards Subcommittees (Appendix B)

Vacancies on the subcommittees are holding up review of courses in the CEMC pipeline. TAOC members have until September 26 to review the rosters in Appendix B, verify/confirm current membership and contact information, and appoint new members to fill vacancies. Email this information to jukane@pa.gov by September 26. The commitment is electronic, not in-person. Each subcommittee requires representation of 3 community colleges, 3 PASSHE universities and an appropriate number of opt-in institutions. All committees must be filled in order to review submissions; two-thirds majority is needed to approve courses for the Framework.

NOTE: Appendix B was updated to reflect changes submitted to PDE as of Sept. 30.

c. Dispute Resolution Committee (Appendix C)

A dispute has been submitted to PDE. The dispute resolution process is outlined <u>Section 5 of the TAOC Policy Manual</u>¹ available on PA TRAC. PDE will convene committee members in October to review the dispute. See Appendix C for the committee members currently in rotation.

d. Program-to-Program (P2P) Database

TAOC requires institutions to identify associate and bachelor degree programs aligned to the approved P2P agreements in the <u>P2P database</u> on PA TRAC. For the benefit of associate degree students and the colleges accepting them, it is important that institutions regularly review their respective information in the database for accuracy and make sure P2P information is consistently referenced on their websites, in admissions materials, etc.

For clarification, Statewide Program Articulation applies to a student who graduates with the designated associate degree during or after the "effective date" identified by the 2-year college in the P2P database.

e. Course Catalog Extracts - Submit to AcademyOne by September 26

Point-of-contact individuals were contacted by AcademyOne 2-3 weeks ago. If there are no changes from the previous catalog uploaded, let AcademyOne know that. If there are few changes, send only the changes to save time. Major problems were caused last year by such issues as a change in course prefix number, etc. When submitting extracts with changes of this nature, inform AcademyOne so that they can they can fix it in the system to avoid end dates being assigned to your course equivalencies.

f. Transfer Event Calendar

Please make use of this event calendar to advertise your institution's transfer events.

g. Course Equivalency Management Center (CEMC)

Course extracts must be submitted by September 26 to AcademyOne. Once the courses are entered into the system, CEMC users will need to determine whether a course change impacts an existing equivalency.

4. PATRAC

a. Site Statistics (Appendix E)

Please refer to Appendix E for PA TRAC site statistics for the first two quarters of 2014 versus all of 2013. As a result of the mobile device-friendly redesign, site traffic is increasing noticeably.

b. New Features

New features on the site include a User Feedback Survey, <u>Search for Exam Equivalencies</u>, and the new pages called <u>Resources for Veterans</u>, <u>For High School Students</u> and <u>PA SOAR Credit</u>. The website was redesigned based on the needs of transfer students, the primary users.

Now, PDE is looking for one or two volunteer(s) to examine the Administrators page and advise on how its contents should be structured and organized to the best benefit of TAOC members. Anyone interested in helping with this effort should contact Julie Kane at jukane@pa.gov.

5. AY14-15 TAOC Priorities

Attendees identified the following areas/tasks as TAOC priorities for AY2014-15:

- Need for increased awareness about the transfer system. PA TRAC, P2P agreements, etc.
- Re-evaluating transfer system policies and exploring alternatives such as competency-based course alignment and Core-to-Core articulation
- Incompatible general education curricula makes it difficult for institutions to transfer and apply credits toward graduation
- Identifying course equivalencies that are about to expire
- Completing statewide agreements for 4-8 Education, Secondary Education and Music, with the priority being the education agreements
- Developing a process for updating P2P agreements and identifying additional fields of study for statewide program-to-program articulation



- Improving the P2P student verification process to increase transparency for students and the receiving transfer institutions (NOTE: Penn Highlands Community College added a field to student transcripts to indicate P2P.)
- Reviewing the overall design and implementation of the general agreement, specifically with regards to the 60 credits transfer into the four-year school as juniors
- Institutional compliance and the Dispute Resolution Process (i.e., Is P2P compliance optional? If so, how does any school know who is complying or not?)
- Status of the TAOC assessment process
- Impact of Dual Enrollment and College in the High School programs on TAOC policy, including the definition of "transfer student"
- Developing an Annual Report for the General Assembly
- Lack of training for new TAOC members and institutional points of contact (NOTE: In August PDE requests a current list of institutional contacts from each primary TAOC representative.
 PDE and AcademyOne then provide training to anyone new to TAOC and TAOC-related tasks. This year training was provided at various times during the first two weeks of September.)

a. 30-Credit Framework – No update

b. Statewide Program-to-Program Articulation

Attendees agreed that the three remaining agreements must be completed as soon as possible. PDE will work with PASSHE and the PA Commission for Community Colleges to fill openings on the Program Articulation Committees (PAC) charged with developing the agreements and to reconvene the groups before the next TAOC meeting.

i. 4-8 Education

The 4-8 Education agreement is close to being final. However, work is stalled until new members are appointed to fill seats left vacant due to retirements, job departures, etc.

TAOC outlined the following process/timeline to get the 4-8 Education PAC back on track and to completion by November.

- By Sept. 26 Primary TAOC reps. will submit names to PDE to fill open seats.
- Early October PDE will convene the 4-8 PAC, even if the PAC does not have representations.
- Oct. 24 PAC submits proposed agreement to TAOC for consideration and approval.
- Nov. 6 TAOC votes to approve or reject the proposed 4-8 agreement at the November TAOC meeting.

ii. Music

PDE will review the Music agreement and contact the PAC chairs regarding the status and next steps. The goal is to have TAOC consider the Music agreement no later than November 6.

iii. Secondary Education

PDE will work with PASSHE, the PA Commission and Opt-ins to ensure the PAC contains adequate representation, and, if necessary, fill vacancies.

c. Annual Assessment

i. Assessment Subcommittee – Tom Gregory, Chair

PDE will work with the PA Commission to fill two seats left open due to representatives retiring from their respective community colleges. Tom Gregory intends to convene the group in mid-October to resume work. The subcommittee will present recommendations at the Nov. 6 TAOC meeting.



d. Annual Report - no update

6. New Business

a. IT Subcommittee

PDE has a two-year contract, with three (3) optional one-year renewals, with AcademyOne for the electronic articulation system and PA TRAC website. FY2014-15 is the second year of the contract. In March 2015 PDE will begin discussing whether to renew the contract. PDE plans to reestablish the TAOC IT Subcommittee to assist with this process. TAOC formed an IT Subcommittee in 2006 to assist PDE with developing a customized electronic articulation system. The group disbanded once the system was implemented.

PDE seeks volunteers to serve on this subcommittee. Contact Julie Kane at PDE if you are interested. The time commitment will not be significant.

7. Next Meeting: Thursday, November 6, 2014 @ 10AM-Noon

Julie suggested TAOC members meet in person in November. The general TAOC meeting would take place in the morning; subcommittees would meet in the afternoon. Submit responses to this suggestion to jukane@pa.gov as soon as possible. The PA Commission for Community Colleges will host a meeting of the community college chief academic officers on September 30. Clay Railey (Bucks CCC) volunteered to put the suggestion on the agenda and get back to PDE with feedback.

Appendix B: Equivalency Standards Subcommittees (As of October 2, 2014)

Equivalency Standards Subcommittees review courses against the approved TAOC standards and either approve or reject courses for inclusion in the Transfer Credit Framework.

Each committee must be comprised, at minimum, of the following members:

- At least 3 community college representatives
- At least 3 PASSHE university representatives
- Appropriate representation from an independent or state-related institution that has formally joined TAOC.

Each participating institution with a voting member on TAOC <u>must</u> have at least one representative on an Equivalency Standards Subcommittee. TAOC representatives may select a subcommittee member, based on personal, academic and professional preference.

Appendix D: Composite PA TRAC Status Report for Participating Institutions as of September 15, 2014

NOTES:

- 1. **Program Search** allows students to search for institutions by program of study. Degree program information is uploaded by each institution at least once year; PASSHE's Office of the Chancellor provides degree program information for the PASSHE universities.
- 2. Course Search allows students to search for institutions based upon specific course criteria. Institutions submit course extracts once a year.
- 3. Course Equivalency Search allows students to find out how specific courses taken at one college transfer to another college.
- 4. **Transfer Agreements** are articulation agreements that allow students to transfer in or out of a college, including P2P agreements.
- 5. **College Profile** is where a college provides institution-specific information to transfer students. *Profile Views* represents the total times a college's transfer profile has been viewed since January 16, 2009. *Request Info Views* represents the total times the "Request Information" page has been viewed since January 16, 2009. *Requests for More Information* are submitted electronically to the point of contact responsible for maintaining the institution's profile.
