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
Pilot Project Wrap-Up Meeting

- Agenda included an overview of each agreement and a discussion of the components of the pilot articulation process with PAC members.
- PDE will revise the articulation model/process according to recommendations from meeting and final pilot reports and submit to TAOC for approval.

Statewide Articulation Does Not Guarantee Admission

Issue:

Students might interpret statewide articulation as a guarantee of admission to the parallel bachelor degree program or to a participating 4-year institution.



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Affect of Statewide Articulation on Institutional Transfer Policy

Issue:

Institutions retain the authority to establish and maintain their own policies concerning admission to the institution and degree program, as long as such policies are consistent with those applied to native students at the institution.

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Proposed Resolution

All decisions made with respect to the transfer process, including admission to the college and parallel bachelor degree program, will be subject to the four-year institution's specific program requirements and will be consistent with such requirements for native students.



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- all of the required major competencies identified in the Agreement.
- Successful completion of at least 30 credits of the Transfer Credit Framework.
- Minimum grade of C or better in all majorspecific competencies.

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Math: Major-Specific Competencies

- REQUIRED Content Areas
 - Calculus
 - Foundations of Higher Mathematics/Mathematical Proof
- RECOMMENDED Content Areas
 Recommended students complete competencies in
 <u>at least one</u> of the following areas
 - Linear Algebra
 - Differential Equations

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Math: Framework & General Coursework

30-Credit Transfer Credit Framework

- May apply up to 8 credits from the Calculus content area to Category 3.
- May apply up to 8 credits of Calculus-Based Physics to Category 4

RECOMMENDED General Coursework

- Calculus-Based Physics -1 or 2 courses
- Computer Science –1 or 2 courses

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 Grade of C or better should be required of all major-content areas not just Research Design and Analysis

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Minimum GPA Requirements for All Agreements?

Issues from prior meetings:

 Psychology Agreement requires minimum 2.0 GPA in Research Methods & Analysis only.

- Math Agreement requires minimum 2.0 GPA in all major content areas.
- Institutional policies vary on transfer of D grades for major courses.
- Many institutions require grades of C or better in major courses.

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Proposed Resolution

- <u>Students transferring under any statewide articulation</u> agreement must earn a minimum grade of C or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) in all major coursework included in the associate degree.
- Students transferring under a statewide articulation agreement leading to teacher certification must earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale at the associate-degree granting institution.

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PK-4 Certification Agreement

- TAOC approved Agreement by a vote of 28-5
- Issues submitted w/ votes:
 - NAEYC standards should be required not expected.
 - ELL competencies should be taken at 4-yr college.
 - Public Speaking should be included to align w/ Framework requirements.
 - Transfer Checklist should be a suggestion not a requirement.
 - Agreement includes both competencies and credit hour distribution requirements.

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
Issues Submitted with Votes (cont.)

- Credit ranges listed for the major core are 30-45 credits.
- 30-credit major core offers no flexibility for students.
- Need an additional option with more flexibility that meets the needs of students planning to transfer immediately upon completing the associate degree.











Issues from prior meetings:

- Who will verify that associate degree programs meet the required competencies?
- How will programs be verified?
- How will students know which institutions honor the agreements and when?
- How will receiving 4-year institutions know a student is eligible for transfer under an Agreement?

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Proposed Resolution

- Institutions will use a **Program Articulation Matrix** to show where competencies are embedded in AA/AS.
- Institutions will submit matrices to PDE prior to effective date of agreement.
- PDE will serve as the repository for the articulation matrices.
- PDE will notify TAOC when matrix is submitted and list the institution on PA TRAC.
